INTRO

What does it mean to follow Jesus?

In order to answer that question we have to come to terms with 3 things:

1. Who Jesus is and proclaimed himself to be.
2. What Jesus' purpose is.
3. The way Jesus teaches we should live.

Answering “the Jesus question” by coming to terms with who Jesus is, what his purpose is, and how He says we should follow him are the heart of the Gospel of Mark. In fact that is the only thing that Mark’s Gospel is concerned with. John Mark, the writer of this Gospel, was concerned mainly with getting to the core facts of life and ministry of Jesus. Anyone who reads the Gospel of Mark with spiritual sensitivity will come away both challenged and encouraged to follow Jesus, the Messiah, the son of God, and the servant King.

In the Gospel of Mark, we encounter a narrative that remains relevant in our modern world. Amidst competing ideologies and distractions, Mark ensures that Jesus' core message and ministry shine through. Like a skilled journalist, Mark presents the facts, allowing us to hear Jesus' profound message, witness His transformative ministry, and make a personal decision to respond. In essence, Mark distills the ministry and message of Jesus into three main things:

1. The Kingdom of God has begun and God’s restoration plan is afoot.
2. Jesus of Nazareth himself is the Son of God, Israel’s prophesied Messiah, and the King of the new and unfolding Kingdom.
3. Jesus is a servant King, who brings a spiritual Kingdom where God’s authority and power are used to serve creation not to conquer it annihilating the kingdom of darkness.

Everyone who comes into contact with ministry and message of Jesus the King has to accept this promised King and his Kingdom and choose to follow Him. That is as true today as it was over 2,000 years ago.

So will you take the Following Jesus Challenge now through Easter?

1. Identify one area of your life you haven’t given to God. Actively surrender it Jesus’ rescue and reign.
2. Choose to follow Jesus more faithfully by replacing one activity with daily bible reading.
3. Share what God is doing in your life with someone else.
4. Pray for 5: From October - March pray for 5 people to encounter and follow Jesus the King.

MARK

The Gospel according to Mark is quite possibly the oldest written account of the life of Jesus. It was likely written between 30-60AD. The historical view of the church is that the author is John Mark, a companion of both the apostles Paul and Peter. (*Acts:5,12,15:39; Col. 4:10; 2 Tim. 4:11; Philemon 24; 1 Pet. 5:13.*) Tradition holds that he wrote the Gospel in Rome, largely on the basis of Peter's preaching and eyewitness accounts. Papias (c. 60–130), a Bishop of Hierapolis, tells us that Mark was Peter's interpreter.

{ Mark's gospel emphasizes Jesus' ministry as bringing the Kingdom of God and his identity as a servant King. }

Jesus is said to have never traveled far from his hometown. All 41 miracles recorded in the Gospels occurred in this land mass, just a little over 90 miles in length. For some miracles, placement is uncertain, but it's clear enough to name 22 locations among 35 of these miracles, which are below.

Mapping all the footsteps of Jesus does not provide a great visual, as He was always on the go and the intersecting and overlapping lines would be too overwhelming to process. But the Book of John tells us that wherever He went, He healed, delivered, fed, and at times He even commanded nature.

Here is a visual of the known places where Jesus performed miracles. Find a place on the map, then look at this alphabetized list below to see what happened there. Or, find a favorite miracle below, then look on the map to see where it happened.

- **Bethany:** raised Lazarus from the dead (third resurrection of a dead person).
- **Bethlehem:** place of the virgin birth
- **Bethsaida:** fed a multitude (second time), healed a blind man with his spit, walked on water.
- **Caesarea-Philippi:** where Peter first recognized Jesus as the Messiah via help from the Holy Spirit
- **Cana:** Jesus' first miracle of changing water to wine at a wedding; healed royal official's child.
- **Chorazin:** the city was prophesied against by Jesus, along with Bethsaida, for being unrepentant
- **Capernaum:** (outskirts) fed a multitude for the first time; healed many sick; healed a woman with long-term bleeding; raised Jairus' daughter (second resurrection of a dead person).
- **Decapolis Region:** healed a deaf-mute man by spitting and touching his tongue.
- **Emmaus:** appeared to two disciples after His Resurrection.
- **Gennesaret:** healed many by allowing them to simply touch his garment; the first miraculous catch of fish.
- **Gerasenes Region:** healed the demoniac possessed by "legion".
- **Jericho:** healed Bartimaeus, a blind man.
- **Jerusalem:** healed a man at Bethesda's pool, healed a man born blind, appeared to Mary Magdalene and some disciples after the Resurrection.
- **Jezeel Valley:** healed 10 lepers.
- **Mount of Olives:** possible site of the Ascension.
- **Mount Tabor:** possible site of the Transfiguration; healed a boy with epilepsy.
- **Nain:** first resurrection of a dead person: a widow's son.
- **Nazareth:** hometown of Jesus; very few miracles performed, because the people knew His family and felt He was not credible.
- **Perea Region:** healed a crippled woman and a man with dropsy.
- **Sea of Galilee:** calmed the storm, second miraculous catch of fish.
- **Sychar:** where the woman at the well met with Jesus and he told her all about her life
- **Tyre:** healed a gentile's daughter.

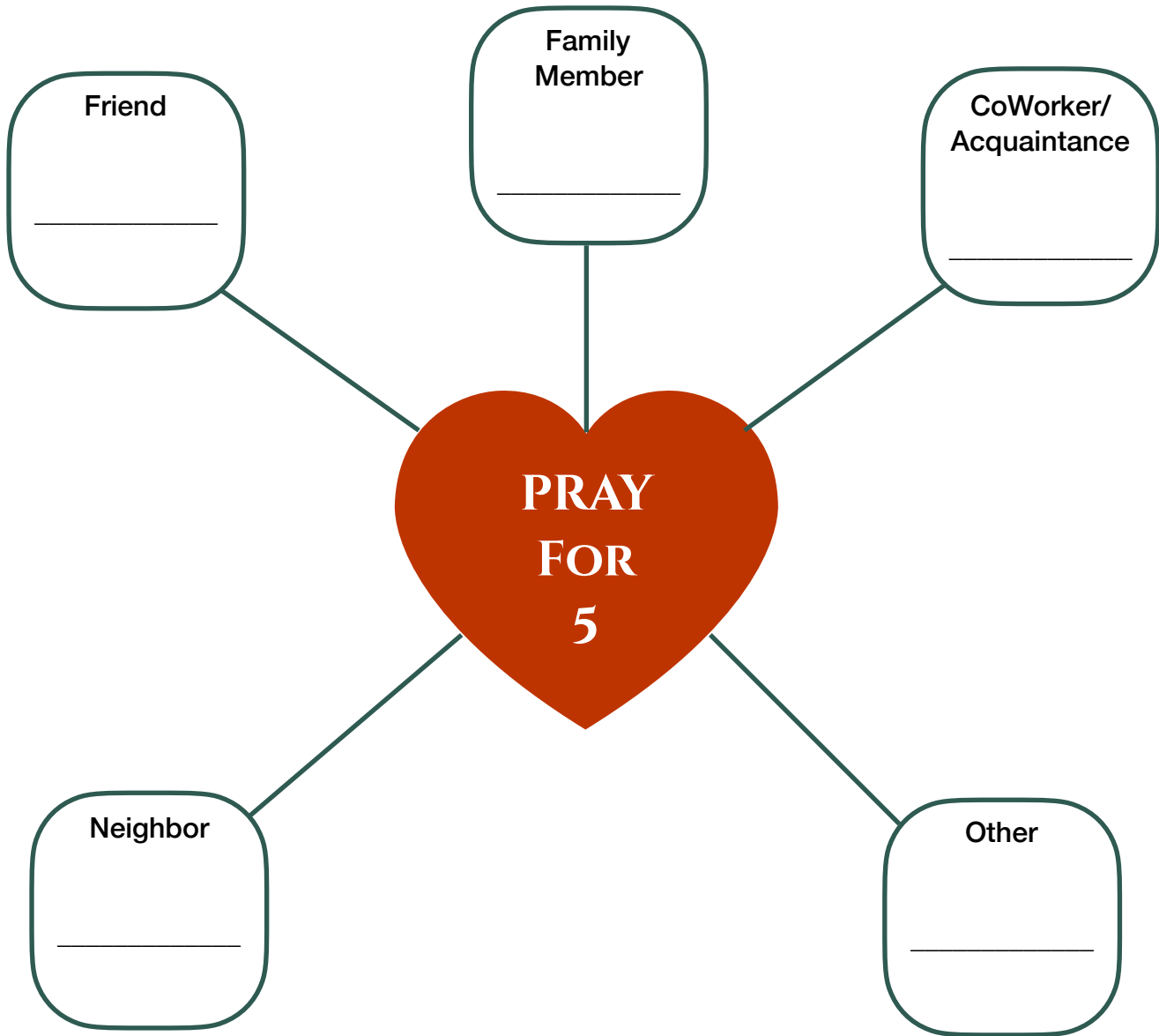

1. FIVE STONES: Find five small stones (light coloured ones are best) and write each of the people on your list onto each of the stones. Place them on your desk, bedside table or fireplace as a reminder to pray

2. PRAYER ALERT: Add your list of five people to the alerts section of your phone and set reminders to pray for them. You could choose one name per day, or pray for all five across your day. Remember to set alerts for a suitable time where you can stop to pray for your list.

5. POST-IT NOTES: Use five post-it notes and write one name onto each. Stick them onto your mirror, above your bed or somewhere that you'll see them regularly and will be reminded to pray.
